I had the pleasure of the company of Cornstalk, Mike and Graig Hickey, and Graig's friend, Joe Gibaszek. In short, four tall guys and me. Well, as Dr. Novak, my Bohemian management professor used to say, "Just because it's piled higher doesn't make it better." Well, on this day, it - they - were.

The day was perfect - calm, overcast, about 42 at the start. Cornstalk was off with the leaders and would finish 8th overall. Leaders is a misnomer. Dan Gray of Peoria ran 52:20, finishing 2:17 ahead of his nearest competition.

Mike, Graig, Joe and I set off together, shooting for a 6:30 pace. Mike could run faster, but the "Coach" couldn't leave his boys. Frankly, I thought these cross-country boys were biting off more than they could chew with a 10 miler, but it would be fun to run together. I must get my crystal ball repaired!

We had run a good time - PR for Graig - and had a good time. All of us were under 65:00! I couldn't have done it without them. Thanks, guys!

Charlie Grotevant was also happy with his time, 68:53. He would later point out to me that there were 42 runners in our age group (50-54) - 10% of the field. Just goes to show how many old fools don't have anything else to do on Sunday morning.

Jim Grace had an "off day" and Carol Pratt and Keith Theisen had to settle for less than their best due to injuries. I think Dave Schkerke was happy with his time, but don't really remember (another failing of old fools).

Mother Nature presented us with a bit chillier day for the Jingle Bell 5K at Shapiro. It was almost a duplicate of last year's with the temperature in the 20's, sunny, a chilly breeze, and random snow flurries for atmosphere. The turnout equalled last year's with 105 runners across the line and numerous walkers.


