26th Annual Steamboat Classic

A beautiful, 57 degree morning greeted Joyce and me for the June 19th Steamboat Classic. We left home at 4:30 for the 7:00 AM starting time which allowed ample time for parking, check-in, and bathroom duties. Kankakee River Running Club members Bob and John Pool and Chris Walsh ran the 4 miler. I ran the 15K. I assume the ever present Mike McGuckin was also running one of the races, although I never encountered him.

The KRRC turnout for this race has diminished from the numbers we used to bring to Peoria. The Hickeys, the Linns, the Judge, Larry Lane, Jeff Lonergan, Leon and Shirley Malone and others were regulars for several years.

Its always a thrill for me to see and meet the several world class and Olympic runners who race each year at Peoria. Paid expenses and cash prizes are a great incentive. 2297 finishers in the 4 miler. Khalid Khannouchi won for the 3rd consecutive year in a time of 17:52. The depth of the elite field was shown when Peter Ndirangu, who ran a 2:06:?? Marathon last year finished 11th.

Following the entertainment by a 5 piece Irish band on the bank of the Illinois River the top 25 and 3 deep Age group awards were presented for the 4 Mile race. What an array of Olympic and college runners before us when the Top 25 were introduced! **Bob Pool** found Gold with 1st in the 60-64 Age Group. Way to go, Bob!

Coleen DeReuck won the women's 4 miler, also for the 3rd consecutive time, in 20:10. **Chris Walsh** of Campus was, once again, in the top 25 with a 19th overall finish in 24:12. It is great to see Chris running this fast, especially after 4 children and last winter's broken foot, all courtesy of Tom. Perhaps, when her family grows to 6 children, she can break into the Top 10. The depth of the women's 4 mile race was evident when Mirian Sutton of Great Britian, a 2 time Chicago Marathon winner, finished 11th.

Enough said about the fast runners. 726 of us chose to test our mental and physical toughness in what is advertised as the world's toughest 15K. The 2 laps up the bluff into Glen Oak Park give this race its special flavor and reputation. This year's cooler temperature and lower humidity made this an excellent racing day. Its usually 80 degrees and 90% humidity. I ran good. 1:08:08 compared to last year's 1:09:56. My 3rd 5K was 21:20. Running downhill helps. I was 189th overall and 7th in my age group and very pleased with my effort.

Maybe some of our newer KRRC members will want to venture to Peoria next year for their own steamboat experience.

Tremont Turkey Festival 5K and 10K June 12, 1999, Tremont, IL By Mike McGuckin

The 25th anniversary Turkey Festival 5K and 10K was run under conditions of light rain, little wind, and muggy air, with 235 runners in the 5K event, and 130 runners doing the 10K. Charlie G., like I, was at the race to add more points to our Lake Run ClubCircuit total. Charlie completed the 10K in 43:51, finishing third in his age group, and 41th of 130. My time of 48:18 placed me 8th of 17 in my age group, and 67th of 130 overall. Stylish, if plain, white T's for all, as well as free admission to a tasty pancake and sausage breakfast afterwards. The event was well organized and a generally flat surface through the first four miles. Other than maybe a need for more drinks after the race, a fine experience on a difficult weather day, a typical hot and humid Saturday in June for Illinois. One can only hope next weeks Steamboat weather is less steamy!

Summer Series 5K

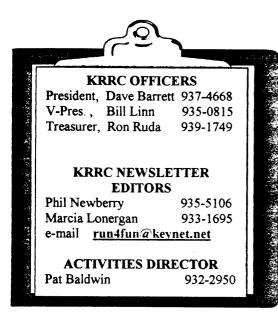

Kilbride Family Classic 5K

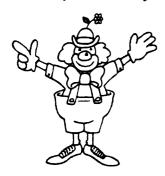
June 20, 1999 By Jeff Lonergan

Citrus Marinade



1/2 Cup citrus juice (orange, lemon, lime, or a combination)

1/2 Cup oil (7 like to use part corn and part olive oil)

2 cloves garlic, crushed

minced herbs (fresh or dried), seasoned salt and pepper to taste Wisk ingredients together. Pour over raw meat in a plastic bag. Seal well, squeeze gently to mix. Place bag on plate or in a bowl.

Refrigerate several hours, turn over occasionally.

Drain and discard liquid. Srill until done.

This is enough for at least 4 pieces of meat.

Suggested combinations:

orange juice & rosemary on pork

lemon juice & dill on fish

Other herbs: oregano or basil

Chicken Fajiata Variation:

To basic marinade add chili powder. Srill, cut into strips and serve in a tortilla with desired acompiments.

This is a wonderful recipe to fix during "Srilling Season".

It is very easy and versatile!
